

In poverty-stricken post-war Italy, Unemployment rates are high. Antonio is distraught when the bicycle he needs to carry out his new job is stolen. So he and his son, Bruno, take to the streets of Rome in a desperate search for it. Their simple tale then assumes epic qualities in the context of Italian society, crushed and desperate after defeat in the war.

A true landmark of neorealist cinema, Bicycle Thieves often features in 'best film ever' listings. Join us as we give this rare chance to reappraise a film so highly regarded.


